

# Minutes of the Redistricting Commission Meeting December 29, 2011

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 10:39 a.m. with <u>Lura Powell</u> presiding as Chair. <u>Chair Powell</u> provided a brief update on the status of the Commission's deliberations and the process being used to compile the current legislative and congressional district proposals. She also provided a summary of requirements the Commission is to use in creating districts.

#### 2. MATTERS PERTAINING TO REDISTRICTING

<u>Commissioner Huff</u> presented a proposal (Commissioner Huff Legislative Plan December 29) along with demographic information and handouts. <u>Commissioner Huff</u> indicated that his proposal was the same proposal that had been presented to him on the previous day by Commissioner Foster, December 28, 2011 (Tentative Agreement with Foster Proposal LD 14-15 Legislative Plan 28 December), with one exception. <u>Commissioner Huff</u> said he

replaced that portion of the December 28<sup>th</sup> proposal that had come from Commissioner Foster's September 13, 2011 map (Commissioner Dean Foster Legislative Plan #1) with the map of where the two commissioners had been with their most recent negotiations. Commissioner Huff also made a presentation showing the development of negotiations up to the point where he and Commissioner Foster were before Commissioner Foster decided he wanted to go public with a new map on December 28<sup>th</sup> (December 28 Eastern Washington Foster Proposal.) Commissioner Huff indicated that he and Commissioner Foster had good negotiations up to that point, but that the discussions about the 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> legislative districts were contentious. Commissioner Huff indicated that he had no problem with the 15<sup>th</sup> legislative district including a majority of Hispanic people.

<u>Commissioner Foster</u> stated the map Commissioner Huff presented (Commissioner Huff Legislative Plan December 29) was new to him. <u>Commissioner Foster</u> presented his map (December 28 Eastern Washington Foster Proposal) and demographic data (including handouts) dated December 28, 2011. <u>Commissioner Foster</u> pointed out an error on the demographic spreadsheet, indicating that the title "City Splits" should have read "County Splits."

Commissioner Ceis also handed out a proposal (Ceis-December 29 Eastern Washington Reintroduction: Joint Dem-October 14) which he stated may look familiar to the other commissioners. He wanted to illustrate that with the 15<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> legislative districts they were able to create compact contiguous districts that respected communities of interest. They used public testimony from the Tri Cities and it also resulted in two majority Latino legislative districts. He put this back on the table to illustrate that it is possible to create logical contiguous, compact, boundaries and recognize the growth in Latino population in central Washington.

Commissioner Huff thought they needed more background. Within a few days of the January first deadline, he said they were within 1% of final agreement on the 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> districts when Commissioner Foster decided he wanted walk away and go public. Commissioner Huff said Commissioner Foster's decision to walk away was a surprise. Commissioner Huff stated that the tactic was a major setback and could jeopardize 11 months of Commission work. Commissioner Huff said that in the initial roll out he had proposed five majority minority legislative districts which were Districts 11, 15, 29, 33, and 37. Commissioner Foster proposed four which were 9, 11, 15, and 37. Commissioner Huff supports bringing the 29<sup>th</sup> legislative district back into the discussion.

<u>Commissioner Foster</u> said his map includes Sunnyside and Grandview, but does not include Prosser. He didn't think splitting Spokane County into five legislative districts was necessary. <u>Commissioner Foster</u> said he doesn't believe he would use the word "agree" with where they were in their negotiations.
